Adams County Voluntary Stewardship Program Attend an upcoming public meeting on the Draft Work Plan

Twenty-seven counties have opted into this innovative program for farmers in Washington State

Adams County is seeking agricultural producer input on the draft Voluntary Stewardship Program (VSP) Work Plan developed by the Adams County VSP Work Group, comprising agricultural producers, local government elected officials and staff, agency representatives, and interest groups. The VSP is a new, non-regulatory program intended to balance natural resources protection on agricultural lands while maintaining the economic viability of agriculture. Success of the VSP depends upon producers' participation in this program and continued implementation of conservation practices on agricultural lands.

A critical component of the VSP Work Plan development process is to provide opportunity for input to the plan. The Adams County VSP Work Group will be hosting two public meetings throughout the County on Wednesday, January 17, 2018 and Thursday, January 18, 2018, to share information about the VSP and how to get involved, discuss the County's draft VSP Work Plan, and provide an opportunity for input.
