Anchor QEA's Annual Scholarship Guiding Principles

Anchor QEA's Mission

To transform our environment and communities, with integrity and vibe.

Anchor QEA's Scholarship Program Mission

To give back to our profession and communities by assisting graduate students in their pursuit of higher education and potential contribution to solving challenging environmental problems.

Anchor QEA's Scholarship Program Vision

A program to assist graduate students who are pursuing a degree aligned with Anchor QEA's field of work, who demonstrate a personal and educational connection with Anchor QEA's Mission, who give back themselves to their communities, have faced challenges with their education path, and have financial needs.

Anchor QEA's Annual Scholarship Award Rubric

Table 1 presents the rubric based on the Anchor QEA Scholarship Program Vision above and clearly defines the points to be awarded during applicant evaluations. One of this year's scholarships will be awarded in honor of our recently retired colleague, Mark Meyers of New Jersey, who dedicated 25 years to advancing data solutions within Anchor QEA's Technology and Innovation practice. This award recognizes a recipient who demonstrates excellence in environmental data management, systems development, geospatial analysis, and data visualization.
